

Risk Rating (RR) = Severity (S) X Likelihood (L)

8-16	-	High Risk	→	Action required to reduce risk (immediate action or essistion of activity should be considered if >12)
3-6	=	Medium Risk	→	Consider and implement actions to reduce risk if reasonably practicable
1-2	-	Low Risk	→	Generally no action required, monitor & review to ensure risk remains low

Hazard Prompt List (Not Exhaustive):

Workplace: adverse weather, cold surfaces, collision, confined space, fall from ht., falling objects, fire, glare, hot surfaces, inadequate access, noise, operation of vehicles, poor lighting, sharps, significant noise, significant vibration, slip/trip/fall, structural collapse, stressful environment, unsafe storage, unstable stacking.

Ergonomic: manual handling, poor ergonomics, repetitive motion, overreaching

Agents: biological substances, explosive substances, flammable fluids, flammable gas / mist / fumes / dust, ionising / non-ionising radiation, lasers, UV light.

Equipment: compressed air, crushing, cutting / severing, drawing-in / trapping, entanglement, friction / abrasion, high pressure fluid injection, impact, shearing, slips / trips / falls, stabbing / puncture, stored energy,

Electrical: direct electrical contact, electro-magnetic effects, electrostatic phenomena, indirect electrical contact, short circuit / overload, electrical source of ignition.

Artefact handling (Cuts, abrasions, bruising)	All	Students to handle artefacts only if the supervising staff member gives them permission to do so. Students are to apply common sense and behave responsibly while handling artefacts - no running, throwing artefacts, or playing around with them in an irresponsible way. Staff to be aware of first aid kit location and apply basic first aid in the event of a cut or abrasion (applying plaster). Duty manager and curatorial team members fully trained in first aid and contactable via radio at all times in the instance of a severe puncture or cut.
