RISK MANAGEMENT STRATEGIES	NORMAL OPERATIONS	Attentive & Observant Staff ○○○○ Anticipate 'jelly legs' and walk in front of racers down stairs ○ Ensuring loose clothing and jewellery is removed/secured ○○ Carefully explain all aspects of the operation and ensure comprehension ○○○○ Escort customers onto Bouncy ○ Customers wear protective gear ○○○ Waivers used to elicit previous injury information ○○ Well train all staff and refresh & review via regular job chats ○○○○ Demonstration and verbal instruction (language barrier) ○○○○	Sharp edges are clearly marked or removed if possible ○○○○ Stairs are kept clean and grip/tread is used ○○○○ Markings on trip hazards ○○○○ Daily (periodical) checks to ensure worthiness of machinery ○○○○ Backup systems and procedures ensure mechanical failure doesn't compromise safety ○○○○	Use lighting before dusk ○○○ Notify customers when conditions worsen (windy/wet/light) ○○ Closing ride if conditions are too bad ○○○○ Eyewear used to improve and protect vision ○○
