Given that this is a swimming based activity we require a ratio of 4:1 of children to teachers or parents.

Supervision at all times is the responsibility of he group organizer/leader.

The group organizer /leader must first see management before the children enter the pool premises. You will be

given instructions for the group. School groups will generally be restricted to the splash pool.
